From wrap-around care in Pre and Junior School and day, flexi, weekly, and full-boarding options in Senior School, Loretto offers flexibility to modern families. Pupils can board from age 12. Our Pupils

Loretto pupils are well-rounded and determined. With a 99% A Level pass rate in 2024, pupils at the school perform exceptionally well academically. Our Staff

We have a very friendly and supportive Common Room with a wide range of interests and life stories. The demographic of the staff is varied from newly qualified teachers to those who know the school and its history inside out. Wider School Responsibilities

Terms of the Post
