Senior Biology Technician

full-time permanent, term-time only from August 2025.

Introduction

We are looking for a meticulous, dedicated Senior Biology Technician to join our Biology department at Strathallan School from August 2025.

The successful candidate will work during term-time only on a full-time, permanent basis. The Biology Technician will support the Head of Biology with administrative tasks (such as ordering equipment and supplies) as well as practical tasks such as the preparation of experiments. Hours of work are 37.5 per week, Monday to Friday 8.00am to 4.30pm with an hour's unpaid lunch break.

The Biology Department

The Biology department currently has five teaching laboratories. There are five teaching staff (most with additional responsibilities and so not teaching a full time timetable). The Biology technician / Senior technician has a large preparation room and a separate store room. There is also a Biology staff room for meeting the department informally. The Biology resource storage area has recently been updated to give a modern working environment. The school site has a plethora of natural resources available outside to enhance the teaching of Biology.

The School



Strathallan School is a leading co-educational boarding and day school with an outstanding reputation academically, in sports and the arts. There are c. 590 pupils of ages 5-18, divided between Strathallan Prep School and Strathallan Senior School. There are three senior Girls' Houses, four senior Boys' Houses and a junior boarding house. Approximately 65% of the pupils are full boarders.

The School is situated in the beautiful Earn Valley as a self-contained wooded estate of 153 acres on the edge of the village of Forgandenny. Perth is the nearest town some ten minutes away by car and

access to the motorways puts Edinburgh (45 mins), Glasgow (I hr) and the Scottish Highlands within easy reach.

The school is well-resourced with a mixture of traditional and modern buildings. The Main Building, a Grade B listing, was once a large private mansion, bought by the School's founder, Harry Riley, in 1919 when he moved the School from its original 1913 location in Bridge of Allan.

The school exists to provide an inclusive all-round education for its pupils in a nurturing and caring environment. Our aim is to engage pupils to be their best and prepare them for the demands of further study and future work in an increasingly diverse global university and employment market. We achieve all this through opportunities that inspire and challenge and by expecting effort and hard work from each individual pupil in achieving their best, based on values of **respect**, **kindness**, **honesty**, **hard work**, **humility** and **excellence** all underpinned by the fundamental value of **love**.

Core Purpose

The post-holder is expected to uphold the values and ethos of Strathallan School and act as an ambassador for the school.

The Senior Biology Technician will work in conjunction with the Head of Biology to support the smooth operation of the Biology department / Science departments. The successful candidate will co-ordinate and oversee the use of practical and other resource for teachers within the department. In this varied post, the post holder will require a good understanding of Health & Safety and safe working practices including Risk Assessments.

Biology Technician /Senior Technician responsibilities:

- Promote and observe a healthy and safe working environment.
- Aid the teaching staff in organising and providing equipment and chemicals required for class practicals and demonstrations, including those required practicals needed for students to pass qualifications.
- Deliver equipment to classrooms.
- Collect, check, clean, and return equipment to stores after lessons.
- Ensure adequate stocks of glassware, goggles, reagents, cleaning products etc. in laboratories.
- Organise and maintain the prep rooms, autoclave room and various stores.
- Assist with routine checks on apparatus and materials and the instruction of others on safety issues, e.g. fume cupboard testing, PAT testing.
- Prepare other teaching aids for teaching staff as requested.
- Trial practical activities and play a role in the development and improvement of practical methods.
- Be responsible for maintenance of laboratory equipment, apparatus and resources, where appropriate, carrying out (or arranging for) their repair and/or replacement.
- Maintain safe storage of equipment and materials and the safe disposal of waste material, including hazardous resources.
- Oversee the ordering and maintenance of stationery stocks.
- Help teachers with the production of displays.
- Act as a scribe, when required, for pupils undertaking examinations who require this level of support.
- Be involved in the preparation for Open Days and other events organised by the department.
- Support teachers with co-curricular clubs and activities as requested.
- Help with the supervision of pupils in practical classes as appropriate.
- Undertake any other duties that may be necessary from time to time as may be reasonably requested.
- Keep up to date with the latest techniques e.g. by regularly attending courses as necessary.
- Develop strategies for improving science practical provision alongside the Heads of Department.
- Act as a mentor for Science Technicians as appropriate.
- Undertake Risk Assessments for the science departments as and when required.
- Lead regular meetings with the other two science technicians to improve overall provision in the science departments.
